## Conversation Questions

1. When was the last time you felt invisible?
2. Has there been a time when you felt invisible when you were among people who knew you and should have known better? If so, what happened and how did you cope with it?
3. When was the last time you had an awareness that you not only were NOT invisible but you were an INSIDER? How did that awareness change your understanding of your environment?
4. In the space below, jot down what would have made Ruth invisible in ancient Israel. How would people have added insult to invisibility in her life?
5. Read Ruth 2 carefully with your group or by yourself. As you read closely, note all the references to “eyes” or to “notice.” What is the author communicating?
6. When have you chosen to “see” someone others regarded as invisible? What was the impact?
7. When have you been “seen” – and given dignity and standing – by someone who didn’t “need” to see you? How that impact your life?
8. Who will you invite to next week’s service?
